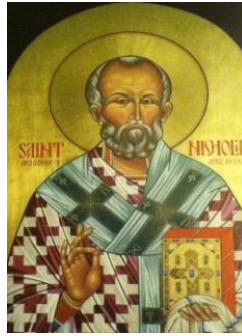

THE VENERABLE EUTHYMIUS THE NEW

TEXT from **THE PROLOGUE of Ohrid**

“ Euthymius was born in Ancyra in 824 of righteous parents, Epiphanius and Anna. He served in the army, married and had one daughter, Anastasia. He lived a strict and long ascetic life in monasteries on Mount Olympus and Mount Athos. For a time he also lived as a stylite near Thessalonica. He founded a monastery for men and a convent for women, near Thessalonica. He entered into rest on an island near the Holy Mountain toward the end of the 9th century. His holy and miracle-working relics repose in Thessalonica. ”
